An act related to corporate registry filings; amending s. 15.16, F.S.; authorizing the Department of State to require supplemental materials and identity verification prior to filing a document with the department; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 15.16, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 15.16 Reproduction of records; admissibility in evidence; electronic receipt and transmission of records; certification; acknowledgment.—
- (3) The Department of State may cause to be received electronically any records that are required to be filed with it pursuant to chapter 55, chapter 117, chapter 118, chapter 495, chapter 605, chapter 606, chapter 607, chapter 610, chapter 617, chapter 620, chapter 621, chapter 679, chapter 713, or chapter 865, through facsimile or other electronic transfers, for the purpose of filing such records. The originals of all such electronically transmitted records must be executed in the manner provided in paragraph (5)(b). The receipt of such electronic transfer constitutes delivery to the department as required by law. The department may use electronic transmissions for purposes of notice in the administration of chapters 55, 117, 118, 495, 605, 606, 607, 610, 617, 620, 621, 679, and 713 and s. 865.09. The Department of State may collect e-mail addresses for purposes of notice and communication in the performance of its duties and may require filers and registrants

to furnish such e-mail addresses when presenting documents for
filing. For any electronic filing provided for in this
subsection the Department may require supplemental materials,
including an original signature of the filer and verification of
credentials. The Department may require verification of the
identity of the submitting individual prior to filing a document
with the Department.
Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
